

### The Vicar's Letter

Dear Friends of the Parish of White Waltham and Woodlands Park,

We were asked in a recent church service to think about; "what makes you feel you belong?" Is it the particular place? The things you can see? Or the people around you?

Belonging is a big theme in the bible. We recently thought about what Jesus meant when he said that he was the 'true vine' and that we were branches. Jesus wants us to know that we need to remain in him, intimately connected to God to live fruitful lives, experiencing his love to better love others. And as fellow branches, **belonging to God and with each other**. We each have a particular place and a purpose provided by our loving heavenly Father.

By the time you read this, we will have celebrated the Easter festival. This is the story at the heart of the Christian faith showing how we are joined to our heavenly Father through the sacrificial death of Jesus, with Jesus telling us that he had gone 'to prepare a place for you' even through death, and then promising to 'come back to take you to be with me', where you belong.

## The London Marathon

Being selected as one of only 17 people in the country to represent Slimming World in the London Marathon in 2024 is a dream come true. I can't wait to meet the rest of my amazing teammates, made up of Slimming World consultants, staff and fellow members. Together we are raising money for SMILES (Slimmers Making It a Little Easier for Someone). Slimming World's own charity, to benefit Cancer Research UK, The Irish Cancer Society and Alzheimer's Research UK.

I am running for Cancer Research, having lost my dad to cancer when I was 13 years old. We also have a member at my Slimming World group going through treatment at the moment, so I will be thinking of her as I run the marathon.

In 2012, I was almost 19 stone, and I had a health scare. My GP told me I had high blood pressure and cholesterol and was told that if I did not change something, there was a 45% chance of a stroke or heart attack within 2 years. I was offered a 12-week referral to Slimming World and I have not looked back since, I lost just over 5 stone in 7 months and have been at Target for 10 years.

Before I started Slimming World, I would not even run for a bus, but my consultant at the time suggested I try Parkrun and I loved it! I have now completed over 350 Parkruns, and I have also done my local 10-mile Easter run twice. In 2021, having been unsuccessful once again to get in to the London Marathon, I took the plunge and did it virtually, completing it in just over 7 hours, with my friend running the last 11 miles with me. I am now ready to take on the streets of London! Please support me – every little helps.

We have had a very busy few weeks since coming back after half-term. The children have relished the learning experiences from the many exciting opportunities the staff have planned and delivered.

First of all, we had a fantastic STEM week, with the children learning to code Micro:Bits, Coding Critters and film their own stop motion videos. We also had Dyson discovery boxes, where the children in KS2 were able to explore different prototypes of the Dyson vacuum cleaner and fan. Finally, all children made a DT project, with Foundation making rockets, year 1 and 2 making





mobiles to help Wallace sleep, year 3 and 4 making a fan machine and year 5 and 6 making a brush monster. Thank you so much to the parents and carers who gave up their time to come and visit the children and discuss their careers in the STEM industry. I know we have a couple more who have offered to come in and spend some time with the children, and we look forward to facilitating this over the next few weeks.

Year 3 and 4 enjoyed a fascinating visit to the British Museum last week to see the Benin Bronzes up close and discover more about the Kingdom of Benin. We had a talk from Grace, who shared with us lots of narratives and facts about Benin, and we spent time learning about the mighty Oba (king). The children particularly enjoyed the parrative of why the Oba is



particularly enjoyed the narrative of why the Oba is depicted swinging a leopard around and possessing fish for feet. The image shows that the Oba was king of the land and water.

We also had time to visit the Ancient Egypt gallery and learnt more about the mummification process and why they treated the death of the pharaohs with such high regard. The children behaved impeccably on the trip and were full of enthusiasm to share their knowledge already learnt during our Africa topic.

Whilst year 3 and 4 were on their trip, the rest of the school enjoyed a visit from renowned poet Coral Rumble. Coral Rumble is an award-winning poet, with five poetry collections, plus 180+ anthology contributions. Her collections have been promoted by education magazines and shortlisted for awards. She won the poetry category in the 'Spark! School Book Awards' 2023. Her verse novel, 'Little Light', was shortlisted for a UKLA Award, 2023.

She was an inspiration to many children, and this led to lots of them sharing their own poems that they had written after the workshop. We love to see when an experience sparks further creativity in the children.



Foundation children enjoyed a visit from our favourite vet - Richard Best. Richard brought with him his corgi Dorcus, and the children loved learning and discussing the best ways to look after Dorcus. The visit helped the children understand the responsibility that comes with looking after a pet, and they discussed all the ways we can help look after them, such as feeding them, providing them with shelter and giving them lots of love.

We continue to have a busy end to the term, with visits for year 1 and 2 to Pitts River Museum in Oxford and Foundation's visit to Odds Farm. We have World Book Day, Eisteddfod finals, Dance Extravaganza and more author visits for the children to enjoy. What a wonderful way to round off Spring Term!

### Memories from the Past

The older I get, the more often people, situations, places and journeys come to my mind. I sometimes wonder how many of you who (bless you) take the time to read what I write, have any memory of me. But the years I lived in Woodlands Park remain very clear in my mind. There was the Youth Club; the fire not far from the church; the church itself with the lovely yew tree (how old is that tree I wonder?), the day another tree in the churchyard was struck by lightning and I could go on.

Memories, some happy and some sad, but each one of them shaped me and it is true that our pasts do have a strong effect on our present lives. It is a

sad event that has prompted this newsletter from New Zealand. I first left UK in 1973 from a wee village just outside Littlehampton so many years ago. We sold our wee home there, having accepted an invitation from a very special family at church to spend our final week in UK with them before flying to Singapore and boarding a ship to Auckland.



I cannot recall any particular events from that week but I do remember the family. Paul was an elder in the church we attended, his wife, Ruth, was active amongst the women of the church and they had two lovely children. All of the arrangements went smoothly, and we kept in touch.

The boy grew up and answered God's call to be a missionary – which he still is now. But news came in an email just a couple of days ago: with all the family at his bedside, his dad, Paul, had passed away; he was inviting me to his funeral. I shall not be able to attend, but hope to receive a recording of the service of Celebration and Thanksgiving.

I have not touched on my return to UK and the events up to date but Paul's passing has triggered these thoughts. The email had as its title, "Sad News" and of course that is true. But as I thought over these things I rejoiced because I know where Paul is now, where Sylvia is now, where my Mum and Dad and indeed my brother along with many other friends and family are - they are in Heaven with a large number of others. That is indeed a cause for joy.

But alas, I have many friends and acquaintances, (perhaps you are among them!) who do not have such certainty; who do not know where they will go the instant they die. If you are one of these, please don't let it stay that way. Accept the death of Jesus, God's son, as the price paid for the sins of the world which includes yours and mine, and give yourself to Him. DON'T put it off, do it NOW, I beg you and then I'll see you in Heaven too!







### **News from your Borough Councillors**

Now we have all tossed our pancakes, it's time many of us will thinking about Easter. Many of us will be attending the church services in the days before and on Easter Sunday and many of us will be thinking of what Easter eggs to buy. Many of us will be looking forward to Spring; such a beautiful season, with blossom and all vegetation coming into bloom.

#### **Our Public Rights of Way**

We are so fortunate in our Ward as we have a huge number of public footpaths to explore and enjoy, which many of us already take advantage of. You can plan your visit by using our handy online interactive neighbourhood map. This neighbourhood map, produced last year, not only shows all public rights of way in the borough but all other facilities you may want to use i.e. conservation areas, libraries, allotments etc. Visit <a href="https://mol.rbwm.gov.uk/mol/map/">https://mol.rbwm.gov.uk/mol/map/</a> and use all the various layers for whatever you are interested in.

#### Lane Closure - BROADWAY

This partial road closure, planned for next month in order to demolish the spiral ramp, has been rescheduled to Monday 13 May - Monday 3 June. This will include the closure of the current designated Broadway access lane (adjacent directly to the car park) with the right-hand lane along Broadway being open to enable



traffic to continue to access the town centre. The full closure scheduled for April, has been rescheduled to run from Tuesday 4 June to Thursday 13 June, 9am to 3pm (excluding weekends), for the safe demolition of the staircase tower.

### Budget

The Budget was passed; there will be a rise in council tax and other services. We have a huge increase in Adults Service provision which will require an extra £4 million to the budget. The Children's Service provision has also increased. Almost 80% of the councils funding goes to Adult and Childrens Services.

Total funding of £118.7m for the council comes from: Government Grants £12.2m, Business Rates £15.5m, Council Tax £93m and £2m for surplus/deficit movements. With high interest rates and inflation, the council is now undergoing rising costs and 50% of residents who responded to the Consultation on the Draft

Budget 2024-25 said they would agree to an increase in council tax. Parking Permits and parking charges are also increasing.

Work has started in King Street as part of wider Royal Borough plans to brighten up the town centre's urban environment, as well as create more engaging spaces for walking and cycling.

Along with new high-quality paving, enabling existing businesses to introduce café-style seating subject to planning permission, the centre of the route will be specifically for cycles, with pedestrian areas either side.

#### **Local Issues**

Many will have seen the demolishment of The Royal Oak, for which permission had not been given. Unfortunately, when work was being carried out to implement the permission that the owners *had* been given, it became evident that the building was collapsing. Enforcement was called in and the owners were invited to submit a new planning application to reflect this new description. A site notice was displayed and the neighbouring properties were re-consulted. Permission was granted in application 23/02106 which you can view on the council's website.

An application in Cox Green has recently been permitted which impacts residents in Woodlands Park - 23/00834/OUT. Outline application for access only to be considered at this stage with all other matters to be reserved for up to 225 residential dwellings with strategic open space incorporating informal sports pitches and land for allotments, with new vehicular access off Woodlands Park Road and emergency access off Woodlands Park Avenue, with pedestrian and cycle access. There are 85 dwellings earmarked for Affordable Housing on this site with 34 -three and four bed houses for social rent proposed in mix of social rent, affordable rent and shared ownership.


